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PROTOCOLS FOR DEROGATIONS WITHIN DUBLIN CITY COUNCIL 'S ADMINISTRATIVE AREA:

HOW TO APPLY FOR A DEROGATION:

- i) All requests for derogations shall be e-mailed to planning.derogations@dublincity.ie
- ii) The Planning Authority will require at least Five (5) working days' notice to assess future requests for an extension of the permitted working hours. Requests received at short notice for scheduled works will be refused.
- iii) A detailed case including an Engineering report shall be submitted as part of the request, explaining why there is a requirement need to work outside the permitted working hours with a commencement & finishing time.
- iii) All requests will require the approved Planning Application Number & Location:
- iv) All affected residents & stakeholders shall be notified on receipt of any approved derogations including the rational for the extended working hours.

WORKS -CONCRETE POURS:

vi) A maximum of three derogations required for power floating will be considered finishing at the latest 22.00 each night or 00.00 for two nights in a week there must be a minimum twenty – four hour gap between each day of the proposed extended works. Approval will only be issued for requests which that meet the criteria above.

OTHER WORKS:

Other derogation request will be assessed on a case by case basis, including those in respect of Strategic Infrastructure Developments (S.I.D.) must as above be applied for 5 working (five) days in advance.

Where a derogation is requested for works to be carried out on a Sunday no permission will be issued for works to commence before 10.00 in the morning.

No request for a dispensation from the permitted working hours will be issued on a Bank Holiday Weekend, commencing from 23.59 on Friday to 07.00 on Tuesday.

DISCLAIMER:

Extension of working hours are not available to assist in the acceleration of a works programme:

Any breach of approved working hours or derogations granted or conditions attached to an approved derogation will lead to the initiation of legal proceedings by way of an Enforcement Notice and/or a suspension of future derogations for a period. Any Enforcement action taken will be at the discretion of Dublin City Council.

If a Road Closure permit is required the Planning Authority shall be notified prior to the licence application being submitted with an outline of the proposed works and the dates & times.

The Planning Authority reserves the right to withdraw or vary the agreed extended working hours at any time should there be unforeseen significant negative environmental effects associated with these works. The Planning Authority will be the final arbitrator on this matter.

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
