In addition to the press coverage the Ministers of Health, Finance and the Taoiseach have all commented on the continued closure.

The National Paediatric Hospital Development Board (NPHDB) confirmed there is a dispute with the developer BAM over who should bear the extra costs of the site being closed since the 31st of March and reopening it while complying with social-distancing rules, which will mean fewer workers on site.

The NPHDB have been informed by BAM that the hospital will open on a phased basis, no other details are available.

Residents have raised a number of issues through the Residents Monitoring Committee. (See <u>Here</u>).

The NPHDB have assured residents that the site will not reopen before the plans for reopening are discussed with Resident Representatives at a meeting to be organised.

The new hospital is scheduled to be completed by the end of 2022 and handed over to Children's Health Ireland to open in 2023.
